SOME CURRENT PROJECTS

Since its foundation in 1979, BTT has bought many unloved historic buildings in the town, restored them and found viable long term uses to ensure their survival.

In 2013 the Trust, together with West Suffolk College, initiated and sponsored a free course for trade students in historic building conservation. In 2019 this became a BTEC Level 3 course, Construction and Conservation in the Built Environment, the first of its type in England. The Trust also sponsors an annual College award for the outstanding conservation student of the year.

Since 2015 BTT has led the campaign and worked with other organisations to try and ensure the town's listed railway station is properly repaired and its facilities enhanced.

During 2019, Trust members prepared a gazetteer of significant historic buildings not protected by listing. This has been endorsed and welcomed by West Suffolk Council.

Since 2019, BTT's project has been to restore 11 High Baxter Street, a 15th C house derelict after years of neglect.
